**Featured Speaker - Gov. John Carlin**



John W. Carlin—61st Speaker of the Kansas House, 40th Governor of Kansas, 8th Archivist of the United States, and student of leadership.

As Governor of Kansas from 1979 to 1987 he vetoed legislation four times while in office. Hear former Governor Carlin reflect on Kansas' death penalty journey and why citizen involvement is key in the effort to abolish it.
